Amount of funding:

Sept 2020 - Mar 2021: Action Plan 1 £19000

April 2021 - August 2021: Action plan 2 £10,900

Rationale:

Following the 2020 lockdown due to the COVID-19 pandemic, schools have received an additional amount of money to provide catch-up support for those pupils that require it. At Ashford C of E Primary School, in order to utilise this additional funding in the best possible way, we have considered closely the research and advice put forward by the EEF and used timely assessments of both children's academic and personal development needs to inform our decisions. The table below outlines our intentional spend with a rationale accompanying each decision; this Action Plan 1 represents the period until March 2021.
