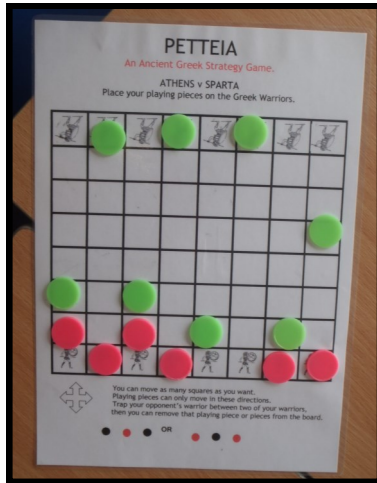




## Greece is the word
