THIS week saw our annual interhouse quiz take place.

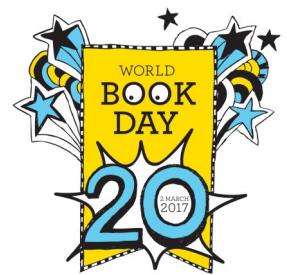
The winning Junior team (pictured) scoring 19 points were
