


What does Black History Month mean to you?

Who is Clive Sullivan?

- Clive Sullivan was born in Wales on the 9th April 1943.
- He played rugby league internationally for Wales and Britain.
- He led Britain to a 1972 World Cup win in Rugby League.
- Clive was the first black athlete to captain a British team in any sport.

Clive's Story

- Clive needed operations on his knees, feet and shoulders as a child, so he never thought he could make it in sports. After school, he joined the army. He was selected to play for an army rugby team because he had played in school, but Clive didn't want to play because of his previous injuries. Clive was scared that if he told the army that he couldn't play, they would dismiss him for being unfit! So he decided to play, but play so badly that he wouldn't be asked again.
- Clive's instinct took over and even though he wanted to take it easy, he played so well that a spectator invited him to a try-out. He decided that maybe rugby was a good idea!

What happened next?

- Clive went to the try-out but was unsuccessful, but he didn't give up. He
 kept training and managed to get a professional contract with Hull. This was
 not the end to his struggles, as he needed another operation on his knees,
 was in a car crash and had to work in the army all at the same time as trying
 to prove himself in rugby.
- Clive's hard work paid off and he became more and more successful, eventually becoming the first black captain of a British sports team.


Why was this impressive?

- He had an 'I can' attitude even though so many things seemed to go wrong


What can we learn from this?
