

Geography

In Geography the children will learn about key landmarks in the UK that link to our Crime and Punishment history, including the Tower of London.

History

Children will be learning all about Crime and Punishment throughout history. The children will start this journey starting from the first laws set out at the signing of the Magna Carta, to Henry VIII changing laws and rules, to how our original police force in the Victorian era.

The children will learn about how laws and rules are passed today and the importance of government, democracy and a judicial system.

Art and Design

In art children will create sketch books to record their observations and use these to review and revisit ideas. They will learn how to improve in mastery of art and design techniques. Children will experiment with different photography techniques to create their own E-fit mug shots for the ACE crime lab. Children will investigate printing and experimenting with tones and effects.

Computing

Children will design, write and debug programs that accomplish specific goals, including controlling or simulating physical systems; solve problems by decomposing them into smaller parts. They will understand computer networks such as the world wide web and how these are a useful resource.

Science

This half term children will be learning all about planning different types of scientific enquiries to answer questions, including recognising and controlling variables.

Children will complete their own scientific experiments taking measurements, using a range of scientific equipment, with increasing accuracy and precision, as well as asking their own questions,
