



## Phonics Challenge 3



This is the third challenge for you to try at home with your child. Before you start please make sure you have read the **Introduction to the Phonics Challenge sheet** so that you are familiar with what your child has been learning at school.

There are 2 challenges which you may like to complete. One is for developing sound knowledge and one is for tricky words. **Please refer to the introduction sheet to find the sounds and tricky words to use.**

### Developing sound knowledge –



Choose some sounds that your child has been learning and think of some words which include that sound. Make some cardboard or paper tunnels and write a word on each one. Spread them out around the room or outside.

Now it is time to play!

Find a small ball or roll up a sock and try and get it through a tunnel. You need to say the word when your ball has gone through!

If you have the equipment you could try and hit a ball through with a bat or golf club.

The tunnels can be made from anything you have at home such as toilet roll tubes or empty crisp tins.



### Tricky words.



Choose some tricky words that your child is learning. It is a good idea to include some that they know well and others that they don't know as well. If you have some plastic or paper cups write a word on each one. Alternatively, you can use empty toilet rolls or kitchen roll tubes. Find a small ball or roll up a sock and see which words you can knock down! Can you read the word you have knocked down? Can you say a sentence with the word in it? Once you have knocked down a few cups see if you can make a sentence with them.
