Maths

Measuring height and length- Children have been learning the difference between height and length and how to measure these.

We have measured height by looking at objects and talking about the tallest and shortest, as well as placing objects in order accordingly.

We have measured length using cubes to measure different objects before using rulers to go and measure in centimetres. We used the language longer and shorter to compare.

Can you draw a picture of the people that live in your house in order from tallest to shortest and label it using these words?

Can you find some objects around the home to measure in centimetres with a ruler? Write a list of the things you measured and how long they were.

Here are some things you could measure the length of:

a fork

tv control

a placemat
