It is really important that you keep on practising these with your child so that they are able to recall them quickly and use them in their reading and writing. 


Watch the videos and then talk to your child about what they have enjoyed learning this year. Can they draw a picture to show their favourite learning?

RE: Remind your child of Jesus miracles that we have learnt about. Show them the video of the calming of the storm.

Writing: One of our themes this year was 'Once upon a time' where we learnt about traditional tales such as 'Little Red Riding Hood' <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=OScqi-fm6U>, 'Goldilocks and the 3 bears' <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Rm3JsewQIWW> and 'The gingerbread man' <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=T7yIUqmw9pA>. Now it is your turn to write your own version! You can either choose to rewrite the story or change some of the characters.

Please also practise forming letters correctly with your child. There is a sheet below to help with this

Maths: Please use your numbots account to practise some of the activities during this week and through the holidays.

It would be useful to practise counting, recognising and ordering the numbers up to 20. Please keep this as practical as possible and use real life objects and contexts when you can. If your child is not ready for the numbers to 20 then work to 5 or 10 to start with. Remind your child to touch each object as they say a number so that they can count accurately.

Practical addition and subtraction activities are also important. You could do this by writing a simple number sentence such as $5+3=$ then using objects to work it out. You can then extend this up to 20 with your child writing their own number sentences. If your child is ready they can count on in their head rather than use objects.


Please also practise forming numbers correctly with your child. There is a sheet below to help with this.

Make some puppets! You could use card or lolly sticks or even a sock. See if you can make up a story using your characters.




