PENALTY NOTICE **FINES FOR** SCHOOLS ARE CHANGING



#### FIRST OFFENCE

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent per child if paid within 28 days reduced to £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days

#### SECOND OFFENCE

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent per child to be paid within 28 days. No reduced rate offered.

The following changes will come into force for **Penalty Notice Fines** issued after 19th August 2024

THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS) The third time an offence is committed for term time leave or irregular attendance a

Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates Court. Magistrates fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found guilty in Magistrates Court can show on a parents future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education

10 SESSIONS (5 DAYS) OF UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE IN A 10 WEEK PERIOD

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.










### Wider curriculum
