## PENALTY NOTICE FINES FOR SCHOOLS ARE CHANGING



### FIRST OFFENCE

# 1

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:

**£160 per parent per child if paid within 28 days**  
reduced to **£80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days**

### SECOND OFFENCE

# 2

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:

**£160 per parent per child to be paid within 28 days. No reduced rate offered.**

### THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

# 3

The third time an offence is committed for term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates Court. Magistrates fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found guilty in Magistrates Court can show on a parents future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education

### 10 SESSIONS (5 DAYS) OF UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE IN A 10 WEEK PERIOD

**Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.**

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# Maths

- ▶ We follow the National Curriculum to plan our Maths teaching.
- ▶ We follow the White Rose mastery scheme to ensure progression across the school, with catch-up materials built in to support children and target any gaps in learning.
- ▶ Maths lessons are taught daily.
- ▶ Other opportunities for maths across the school day are planned for including, morning maths, timetables sessions and regular revision sessions.
- ▶ Number facts and timetables are key to success in other areas of Maths so it is extremely important to practice these regularly.

The SATs take place over four days: Monday 12 May -Thursday 15 May 2025.

The SATs papers consist of:

Grammar, punctuation and spelling (paper 1: GPS)

Grammar, punctuation and spelling (paper 2: Spelling)

Reading

Maths (paper 1: Arithmetic)

Maths (paper 2: Reasoning)

Maths (paper 3: Reasoning)

Mock SATs week will take place over four days: Monday 28<sup>th</sup> April-1<sup>st</sup> May 2025

Writing is assessed using evidence collected throughout Year 6. There is no Year 6 SATs writing test.
