- **Expected attendance is 96% or better.**






## PENALTY NOTICE FINES FOR SCHOOLS ARE CHANGING



#### FIRST OFFENCE



reduced to £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days

#### SECOND OFFENCE

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be: £160 per parent per child to be paid within 28 days. No reduced rate offered. The following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024

#### THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The third time an offence is committed for term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates Court. Magistrates fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found guilty in Magistrates Court can show on a parents future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education

#### 10 SESSIONS (5 DAYS) OF UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE IN A 10 WEEK PERIOD

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.



# Maths

- ▶ We follow the National Curriculum to plan our Maths teaching.
- We follow the White Rose mastery scheme to ensure progression across the school, with catch-up materials built in to support children and target any gaps in learning.

# Assessments

SATs are the Standardised Assessment Tests that are given to children at the end of Key Stage 2.

The SATs take place over four days: Monday 12 May -Thursday 15 May 2025.

The SATs papers consist of:

Grammar, punctuation and spelling (paper 1: GPS)

Grammar, punctuation and spelling (paper 2: Spelling)

Reading

Maths (paper 1: Arithmetic)

Maths (paper 2: Reasoning)

Maths (paper 3: Reasoning)

Mock SATs week will take place over four days: Monday 28<sup>th</sup> April-1<sup>st</sup> May 2025

Writing is assessed using evidence collected throughout Year 6. There is no Year 6 SATs writing test.


