- The gate will close at 8:45 and registers are taken.




# Our ACE Expectations – coming to school every day

### English

- In Year One we focus on writing sentences including capital letters, finger spaces, and full stops as well as joining our ideas using the conjunction 'and'.
- Key texts your child will cover include; The Naughty Bus, Astro girl, Iggy Peck, and Billy and the Beast to name a few.
- We will set online spellings on the platform spelling shed. A log-in will be stapled into their reading record.
- Writing will be achieved through both fiction and non-fiction texts using recounts, sequencing, lists, labels and captions. We will also introduce descriptive writing including the use of story language.



### Reading

- In year 1 we will continue to read in line with the Little Wandle scheme. Just like in reception this book will be sent home on a Friday and will be expected to be returned on the Monday. We have a set of 6 books per title so will hope you will assist us in keeping these books in a good condition. If something does occur let your class teacher or the office know.
- Your child will also bring home a free choice book on a Friday from our book corner. Please enjoy this together and return the following Friday. You can write any comments in the reading records.
- On a Monday a different decodable book will be sent home. These books will be in line with their phonics ability. This book is to read together as it may not be fully decodable for them. We will collect these in a change on a Monday.





- In Year One we focus on numbers within 100. Our aim is for the children to talk about concepts with confidence and give reasons for answers as well as being able to solve problems. We also focus on the importance of number bonds and number formation, relating this to the real world as much as possible.
- We follow the White Rose Maths Scheme of Learning.
- We will cover: Number, Place Value, Addition, Subtraction, Non-Standard Measurement, Basic Geometry and Properties of Shape.
- Examples of methods covered will include part whole model, bar model and use lots manipulatives.
- You can help at home by encouraging your child to log into Numbots and complete the challenges. This log in will be stapled into their reading record book.

#### Wider curriculum

- This year the children will join in with our home learning projects projects will be set week 2 (pre learning task) - handed in week 4. Then a summary learning task set in week 5 to be returned after half term.
- There will be activities set weekly on spelling shed and we would expect the children to be using Numbots on a regular basis.




#### Assessments
