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We teach whole class reading three times a week on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

We use a key text to teach the skills needed for reading comprehension.

All children have a home reading diary and book which is matched to their current reading ability.

Reading is a vital skill that is required to access learning in all areas of the curriculum. You can support your child at home by encouraging them to read their home reading book for pleasure at least 5 times per week.

It is really important that all children read at home as much as possible and have an opportunity to read to an adult.

Spelling

- ▶ Spellings are set on Spelling Shed and are introduced and taught to the children in class every week on a Monday.
- ▶ All children have their own log in so they can access this learning at home.
- ▶ We will have regular spelling tests and children will have time to practise these words during the week at school.
- ▶ You can support your child with their spelling by helping them to regularly log on to Spelling Shed.
- ▶ Keep talking to your child about their spelling words and encourage them to try and use them in a sentence. You can also help them to define these words using a dictionary.

Maths

- ▶ We follow the National Curriculum to plan our Maths teaching.
- ▶ We follow the White Rose mastery scheme to ensure progression across the school, with catch-up materials built in to support children and target any gaps in learning.
- ▶ Maths lessons are taught daily.
- ▶ Other opportunities for maths across the school day are planned for including, morning maths, timetables sessions and regular revision sessions.

- ▶ Number facts and timetables are key to success in other areas of Maths so it is extremely important to practice these regularly.

Assessments



SATs are the Standardised Assessment Tests that are given to children at the end of Key Stage 2.

The SATs take place over four days, starting on Monday 13th May 2024.

The SATs papers consist of:

Grammar, punctuation and spelling (paper 1: GPS) -

Grammar, punctuation and spelling (paper 2: Spelling)

Reading

Maths (paper 1: Arithmetic)

Maths (paper 2: Reasoning)

Maths (paper 3: Reasoning)

Writing is assessed using evidence collected throughout Year 6. There is no Year 6 SATs writing test.

We do lots of revision and practice papers in school.

Mock SATs week to prepare the children will be the week commencing 29th April 2024.

How to prepare for SATs at Home



Don't use past papers as they are used in school to prepare the children.

Encourage your child to talk to their teacher or a trusted adult about their anxieties or if they are finding something difficult.

Give your child a quiet, distraction free space to complete home learning or revise.

Little and often is the best approach to revision.
