### We're all going on a Summer holiday

AS the advert says—It's the most wonderful time of the year— holiday booking season. That time after Christmas when we all feel we need something to look forward to and start thinking about a nice holiday in the sun. We would like to politely remind you that we are not permitted to authorise holiday in school time. If you are taking your child out of school during term time you must fill in the form requesting the absence (available

in school office). Absence of 5 days or more will invoke the penalty notice procedure. Please check our holiday dates by scanning the QR code.



#### **Penalty Notice for**

#### **Unauthorised Absence**

JUST to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days not (which do have to be consecutive), they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 davs. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.
