Setting the Standard

AS part of our vision to be 'the best that we can be' we want the children to be looking super smart in their school uniform.

Here are a few reminders:

PLEASE can we remind everyone that if your child is unable to attend school you must contact the school office before 9am. Failure to do so could result in unauthorised absences. If you are having any planned absence then you should complete the form which is available from the school office.

Parking safely

HELP us to keep everyone safe by being considerate and thinking before you park at drop off and pick up. We have recently had reports of some near misses so please consider our children, parents, carers and our neighbours when parking and approaching the school. Even if you are running late please park carefully and legally.

Penalty Notice for Unauthorised Absence

JUST to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive) in a 10 week period , they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £160.00 per parent/carer per child if paid which reduces to £80 if paid within 21 days. If a further 5 days absence occurs parents will be liable for a second penalty notice of £160 per parent per child with no reduction. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices. Further absence could also result in prosecution.

In particular both boys like the book 'Multiverse Mix-Up.






Our value for this half term is compassion

Costly caring Offering help Making a difference Putting others first Always listening Sensitive to suffering Service in action Interested in others Offering care and concern Noticing a need




We looked at the following passage from Mark as an example of when Jesus put the needs of others before his own, he noticed when others needed help or healing and responded to this.

"When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd. So he began teaching them many things." Mark 6. 34
