It is great to see our younger children making their mark on the world. Fletcher (right) from Kangaroo was awarded this great trophy for his excellent football skills. Well done Fletcher!



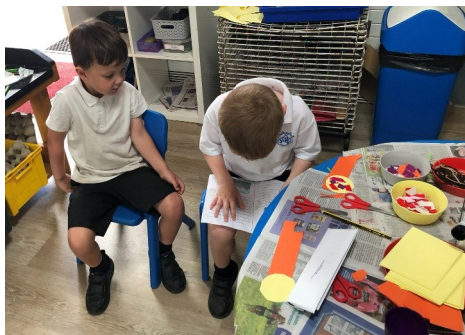
