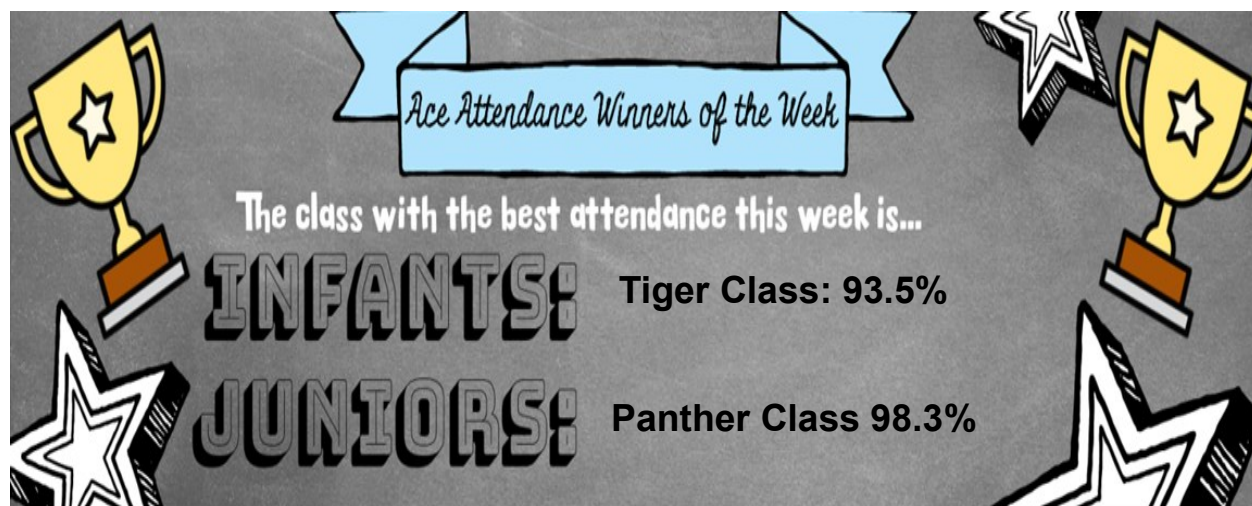


Birdwatching with Reception
