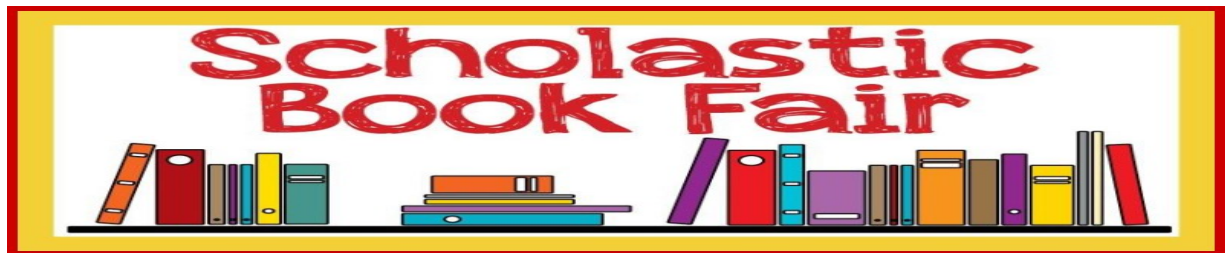

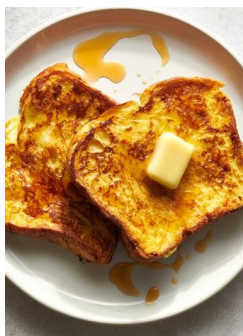


## A Good Start

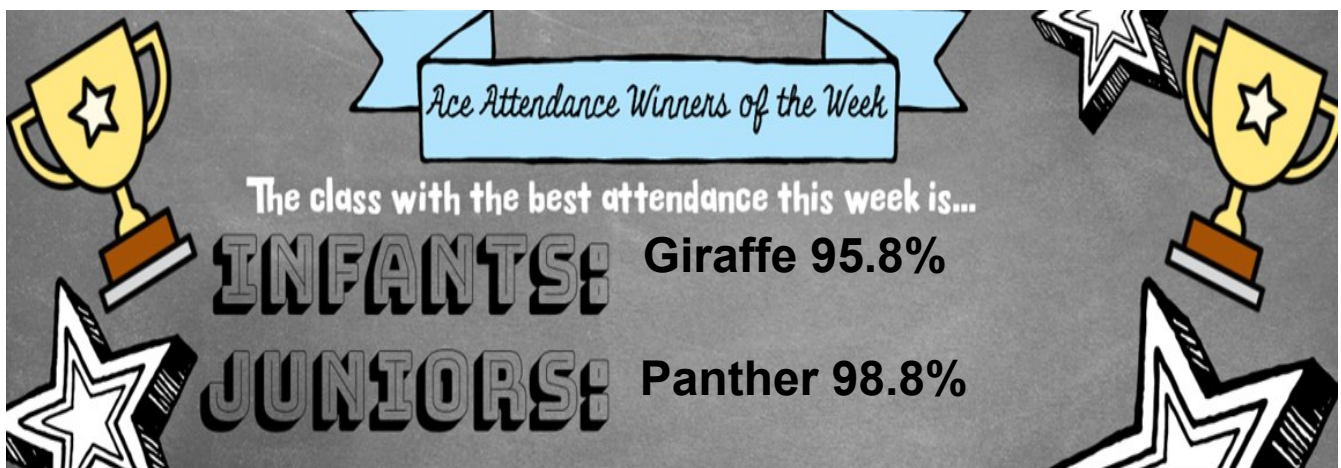
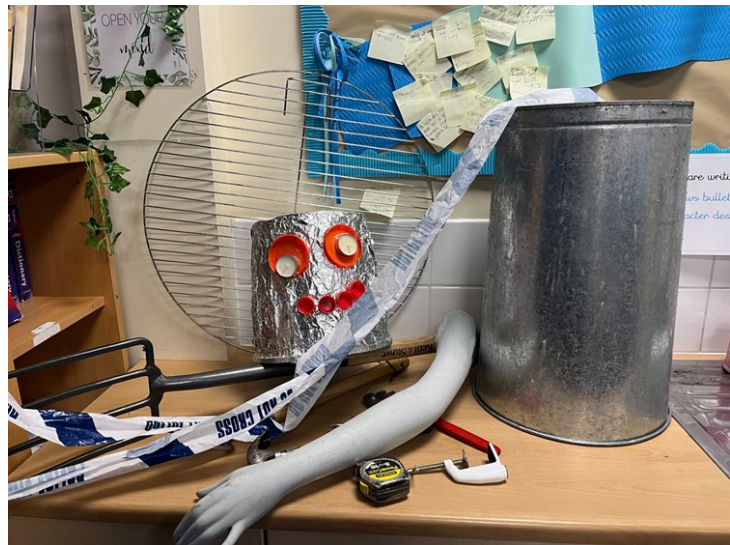
