Year 5's Space Dome Adventure

YEAR 5 had an out-of-this-world experience when the Space Dome visited our school! Pupils were amazed as they stepped inside the inflatable planetarium and explored the wonders of space, stars, and our solar system. They learned fascinating facts about the planets, constellations, black holes and the universe beyond, asking loads of brilliant questions along the way. It was an exciting and inspiring experience that truly brought their science learning to life!



During the War

ON Monday, Year 6 took part in an exciting workshop led by Chertsey Museum to launch their new World War Two history topic. The session explored what life was like in Britain during the war, giving pupils the chance to investigate real and replica artefacts from the era. Children examined ration books and identity cards to learn how rationing worked and how people proved who they were during wartime. They also handled ARP equipment to understand how air raid wardens kept people safe, and explored bomb maps to see the impact of bombing in Chertsey. The workshop included learning about evacuees and the importance of blackouts, with pupils acting like young historians to uncover clues about everyday life in wartime Britain. It was an engaging and hands-on experience that has sparked curiosity and enthusiasm as they begin their new topic.



Spiritual Awareness

This week in worship we have explored how we grow and change over time, not just physically but also spiritually. We talked about how we develop as a person by understanding our own feelings and thoughts, connecting with other people, the wider world and by looking upwards to a presence greater than ourselves.

We shared with the children the poster below as a reminder of how we develop and grow spiritually, starting with personal reflection (the mirror), experiencing and connecting with the WOWs of the world around us and a greater presence (the window) then reflecting upon what we may want to explore further or change in our lives (the door.)

We will be continuing to work on this in school with your children, you may find the poster a useful starting point for further discussion with your child at home.

Edward from Rhino Class has been making great




strides in his swimming lessons and achieved his level 5 swimming certificate. What a great skill to have—congratulations Edward!
