How big and how old?

Mount Everest, between Nepal, Tibet and China, is 29,035 feet high or 8848 metres and it grows higher by about ½ cm every year. It is over 60 million years old.

Who's been to the top?

The first climbers to reach the summit were Edmund Hillary from New Zealand and Tenzing Norgay from Nepal on 29th May, 1953. The youngest to climb it are Jordan Romero from America (22nd May, 2010) and Malavath Poorna from India (25th May, 2014). They were both 13 years old when they reached the highest point.

The mountain's history

People in Europe and the USA didn't know much about the mountain until George Everest studied it in 1841. It was named Mount Everest in 1865.

What's the weather like?

At the top of the mountain it can be as cold as -60° C. Sometimes, the wind reaches a speed of 200mph. In May and October, however, it is warmer and calmer. This is the time that climbers try to reach the summit. From June to September, the mountain can be covered in mist with dangerous floods and mud slides.
