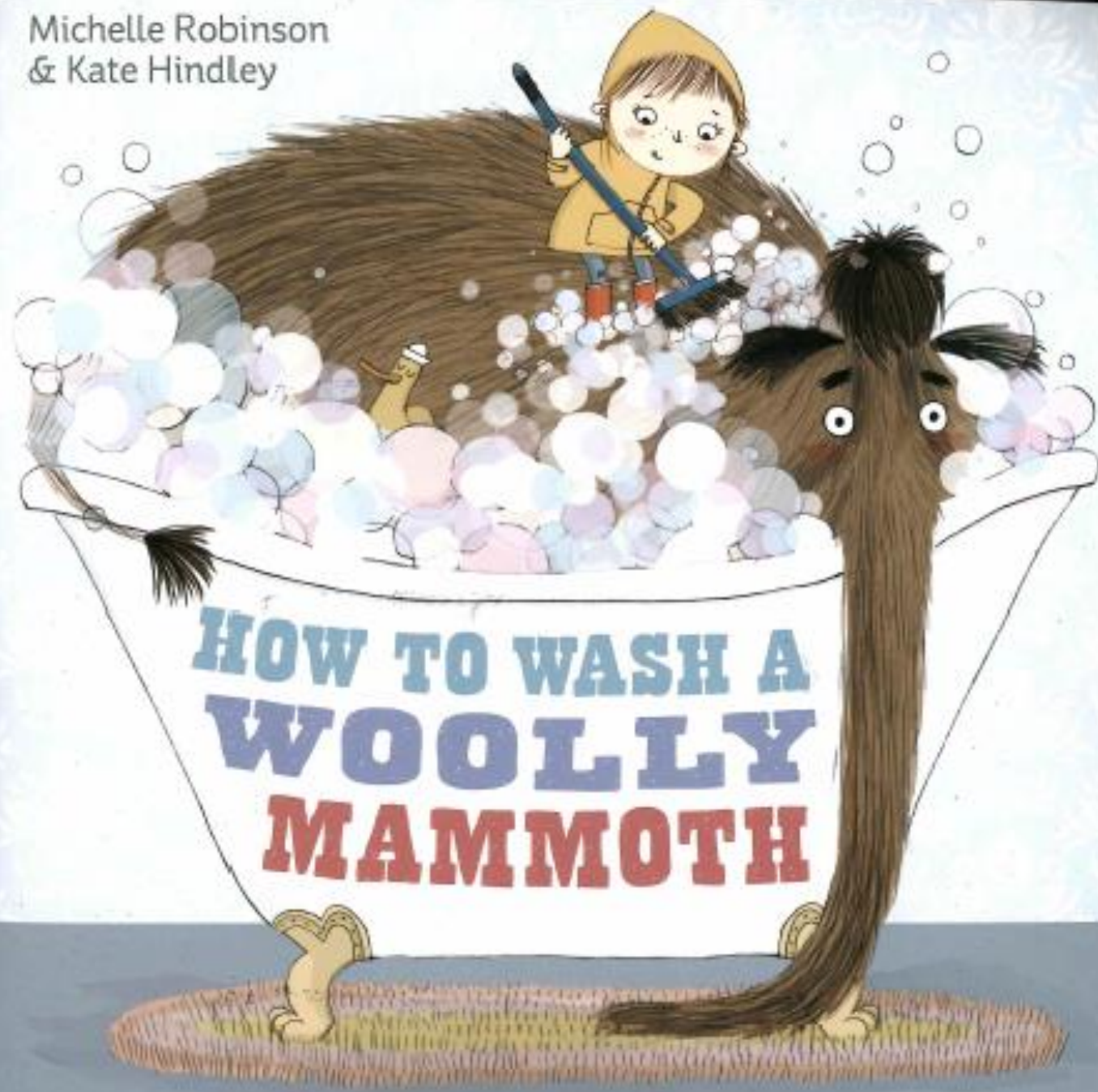

Fig. 1: Empty



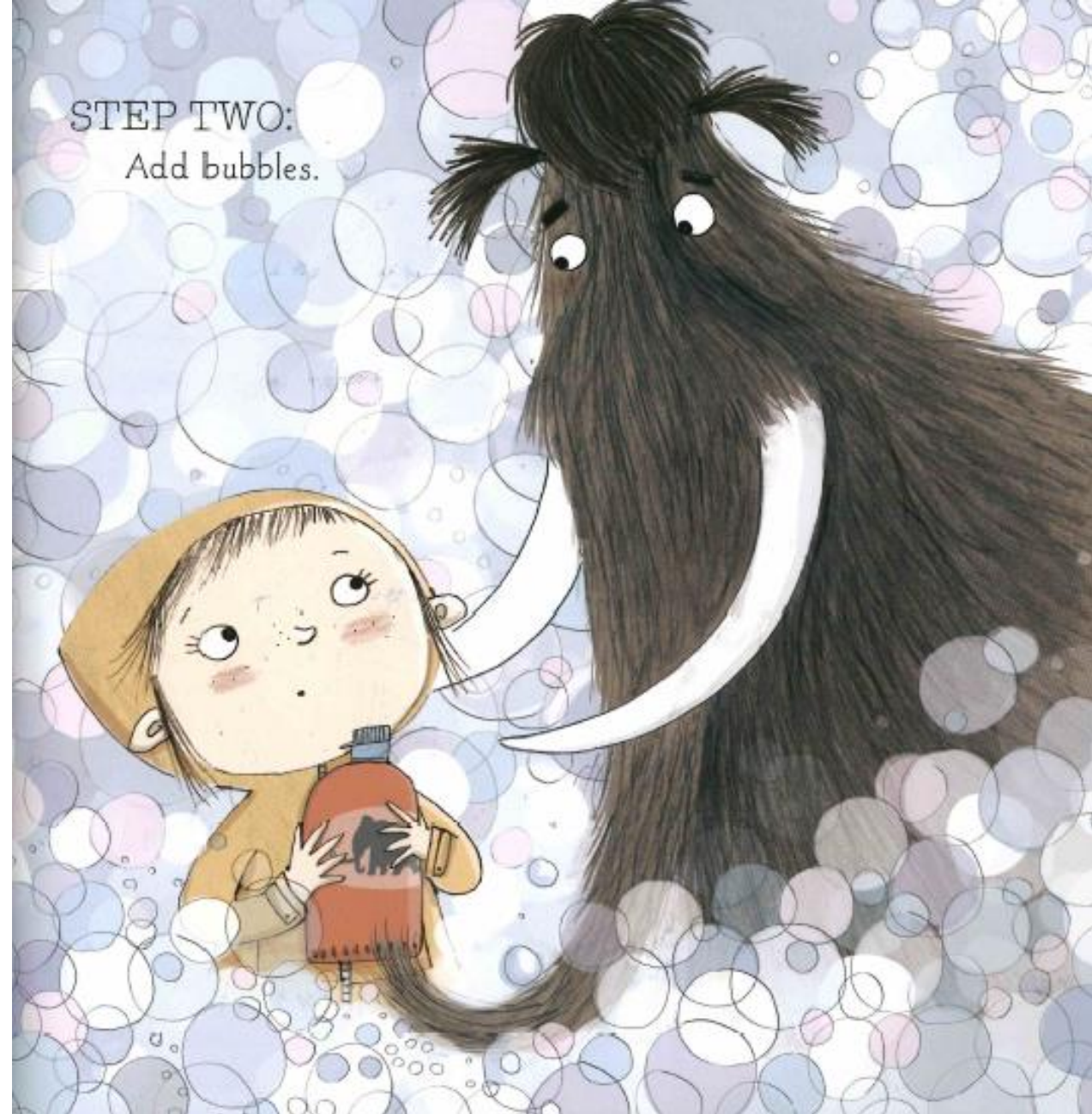
Fig. 2: Full

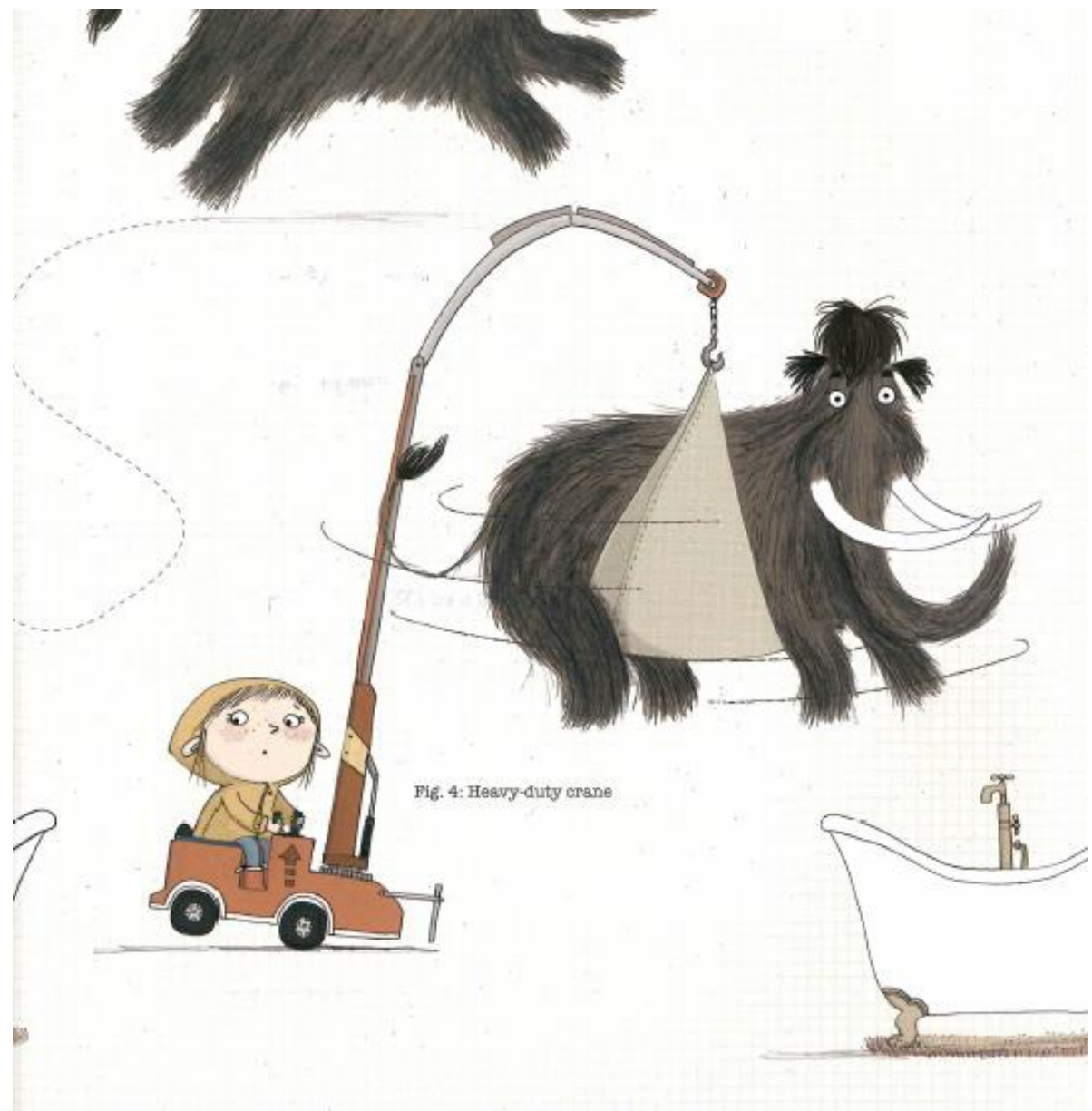
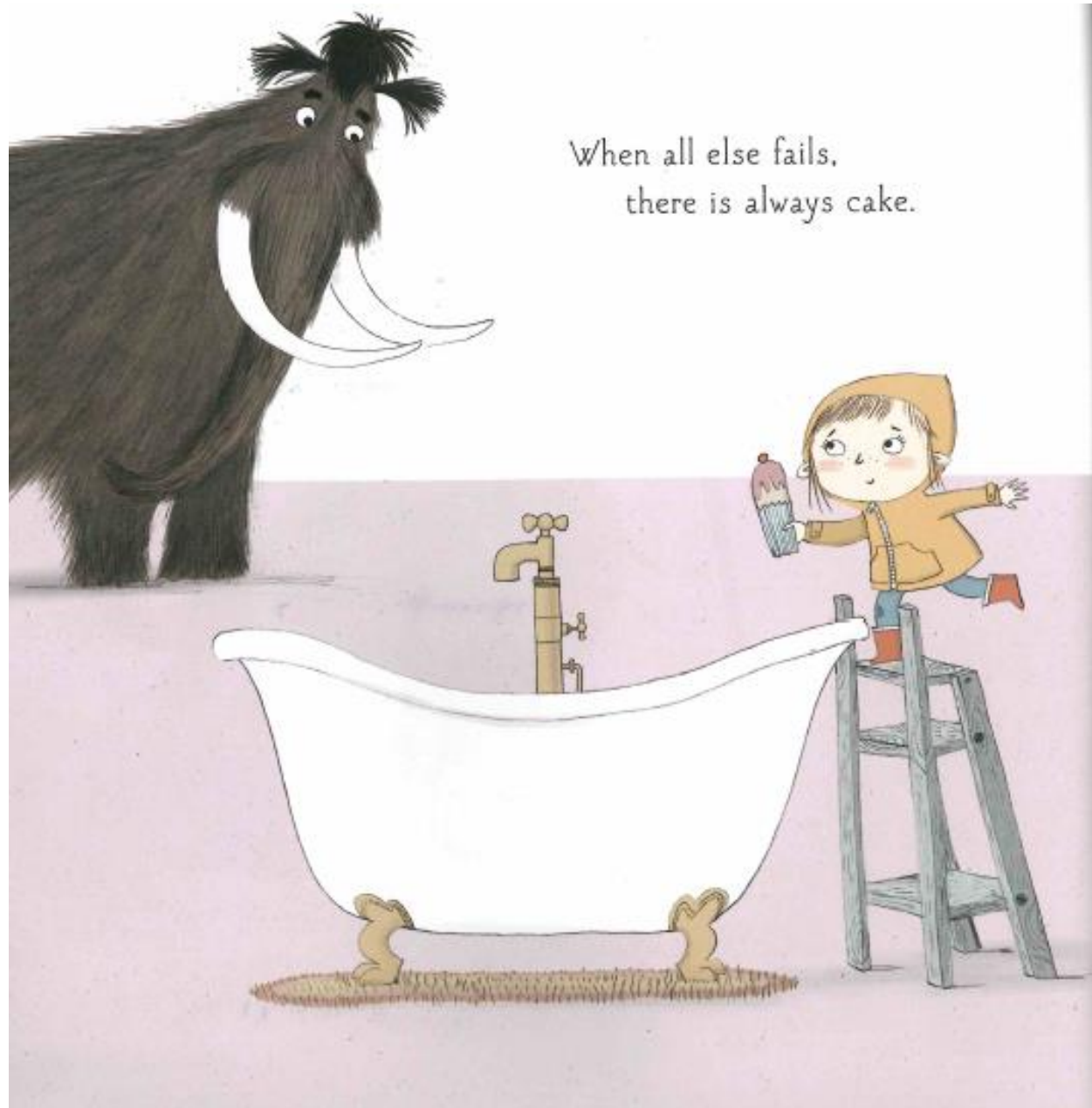
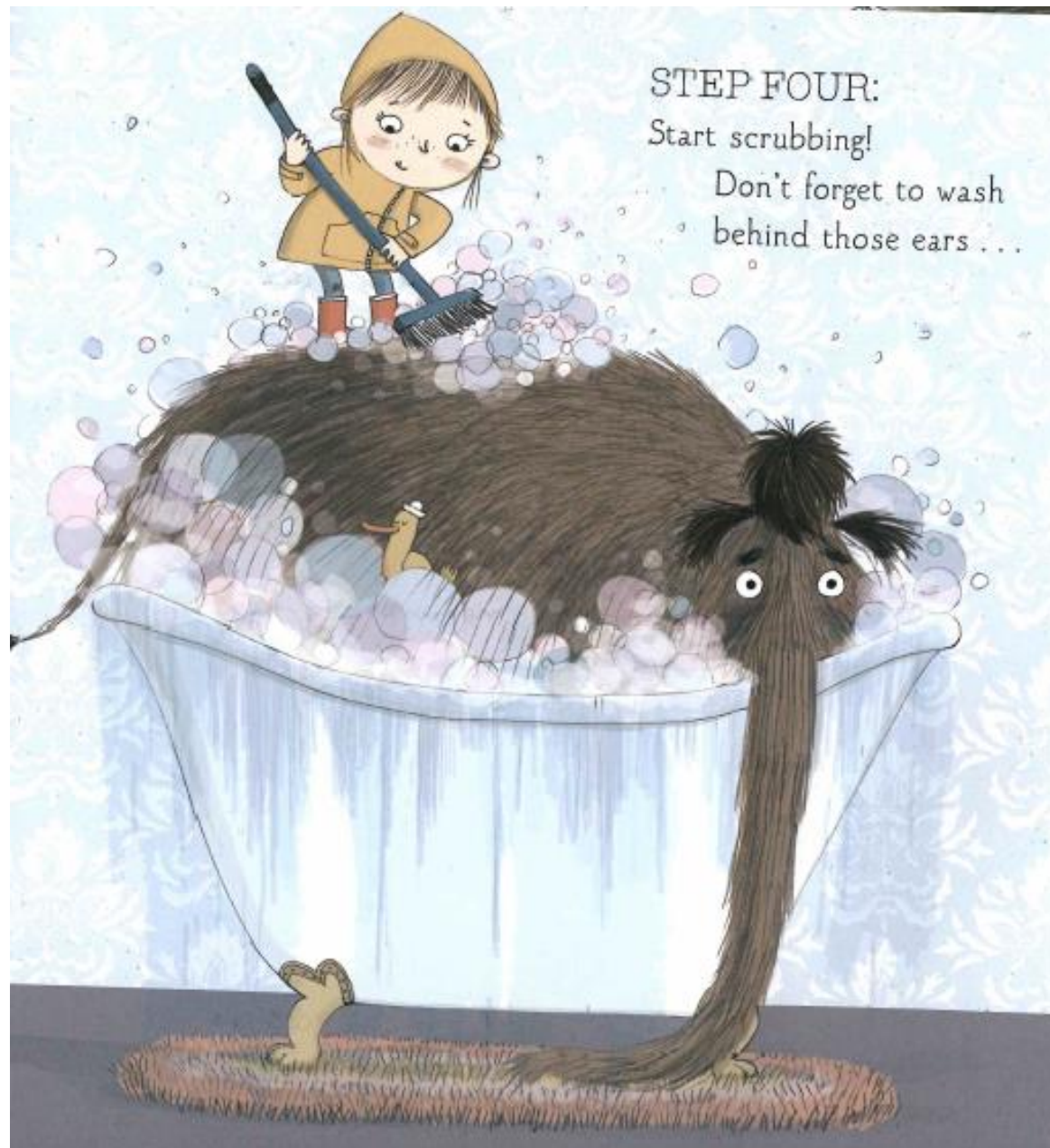


Fig. 4: Heavy-duty crane

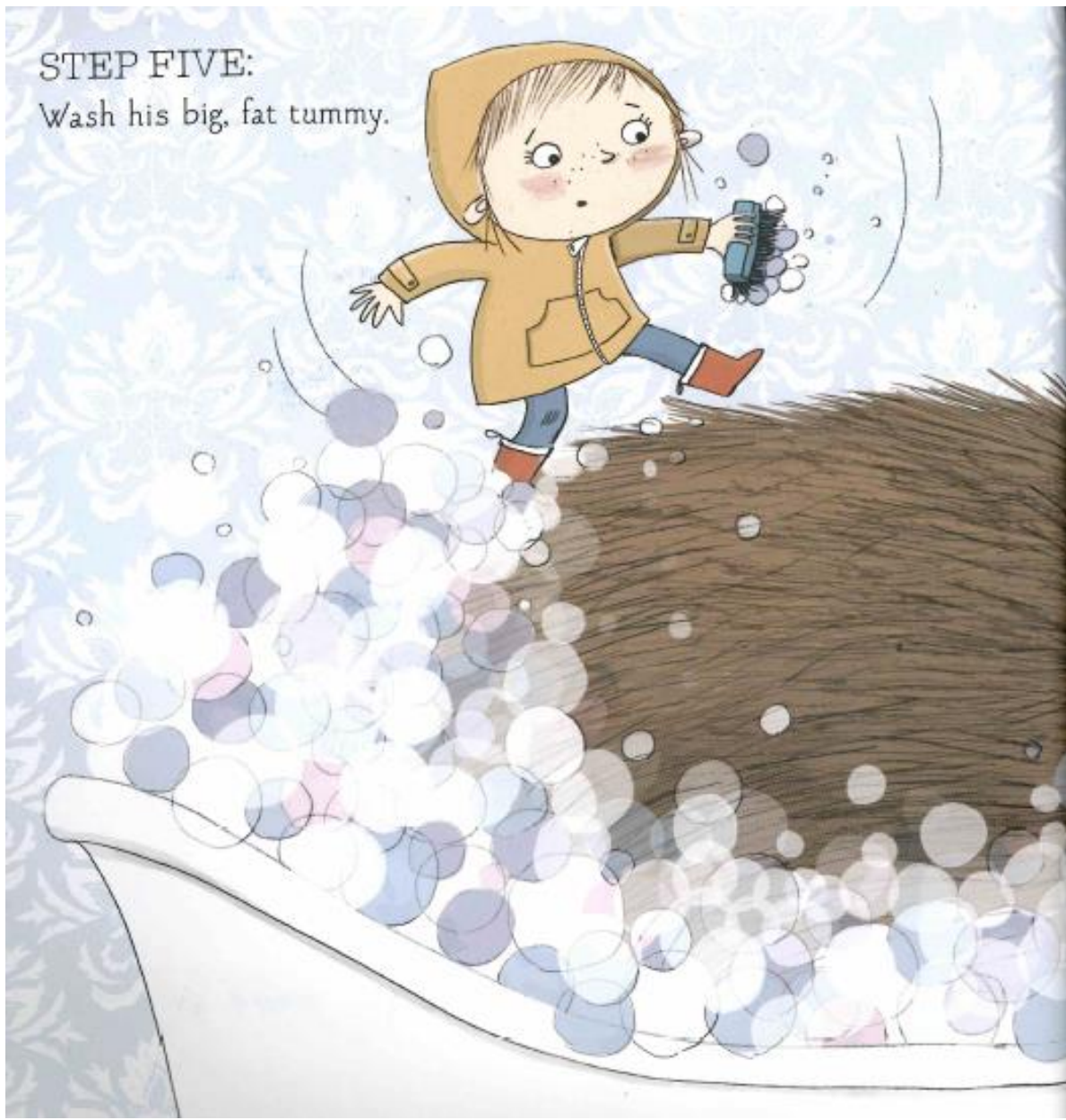
When all else fails,
there is always cake.



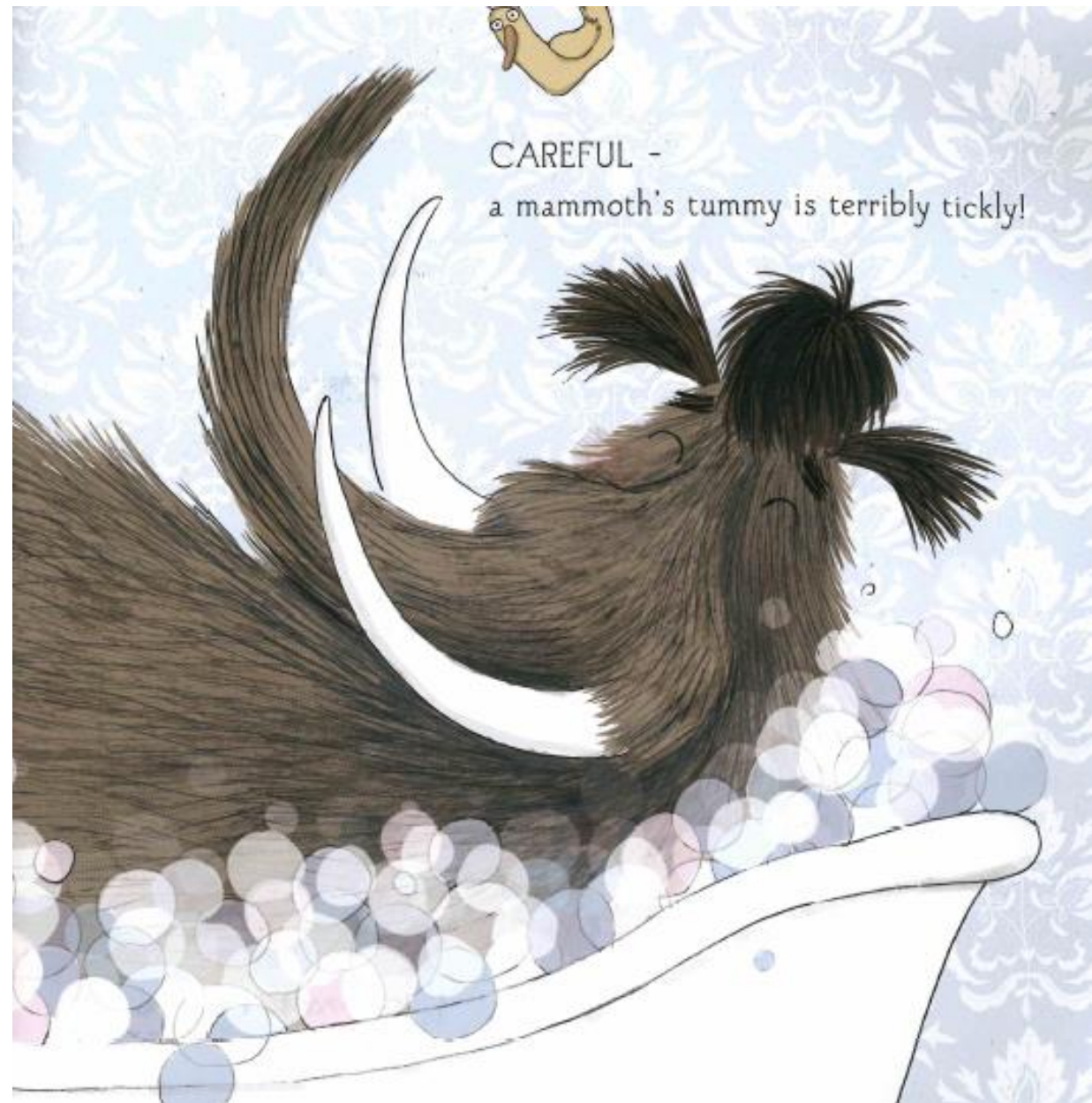
STEP FOUR:

behind those ears . . .



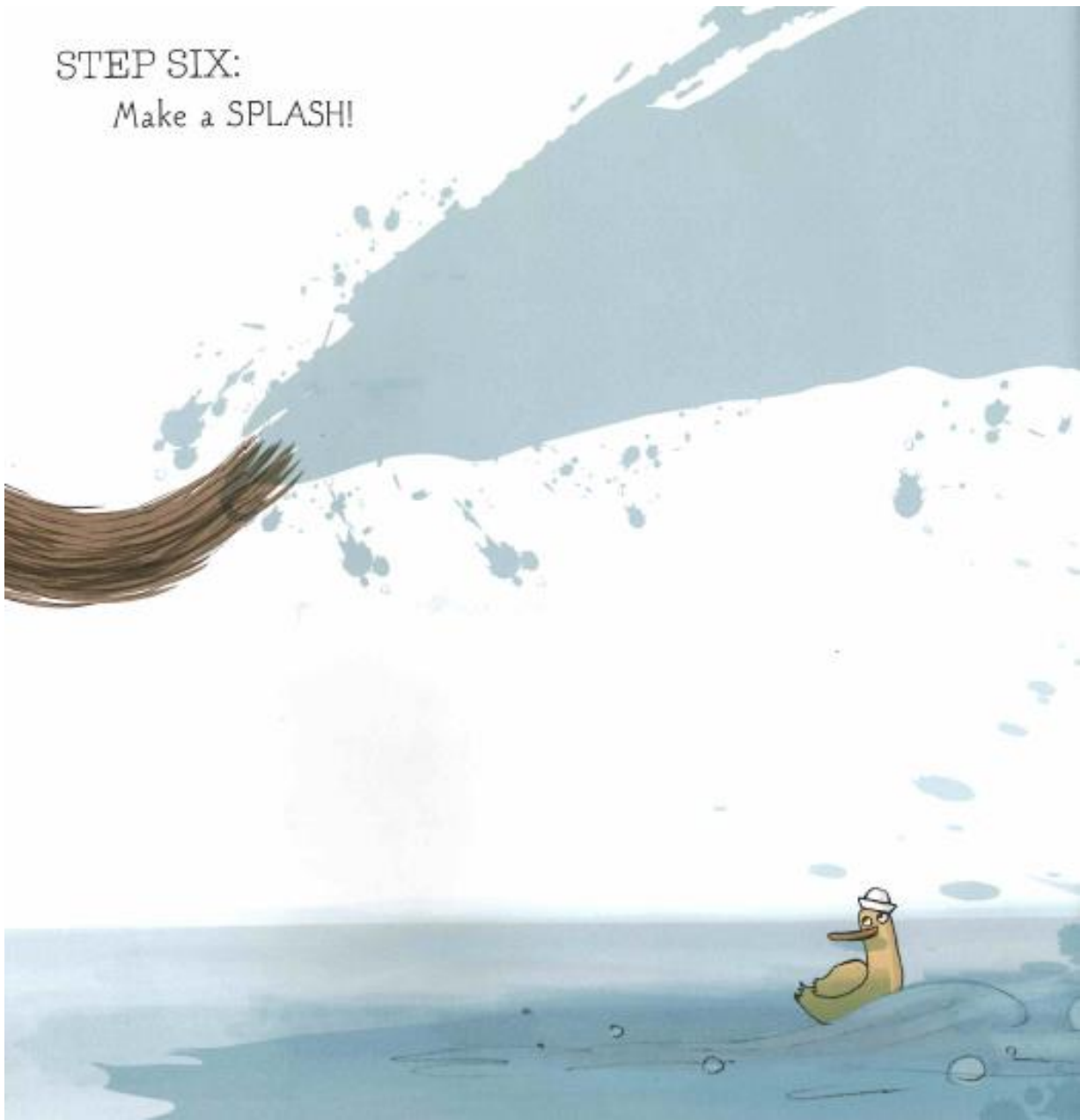
STEP FIVE:

a mammoth's tummy is terribly tickly!



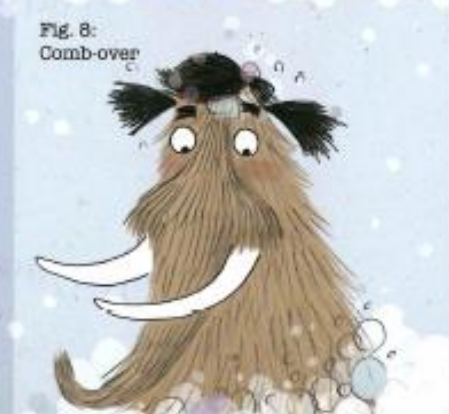
STEP SIX:
Make a SPLASH!



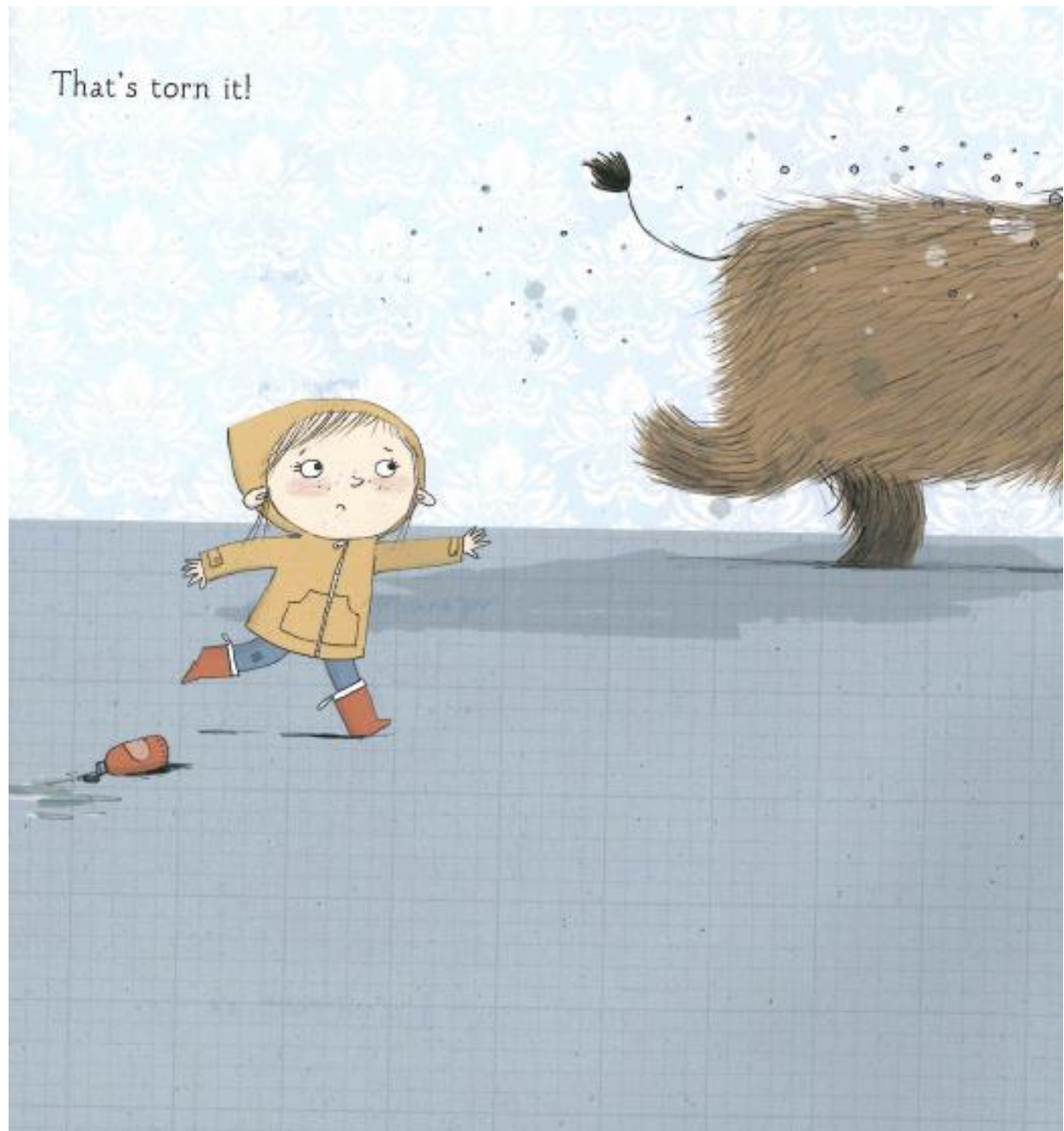


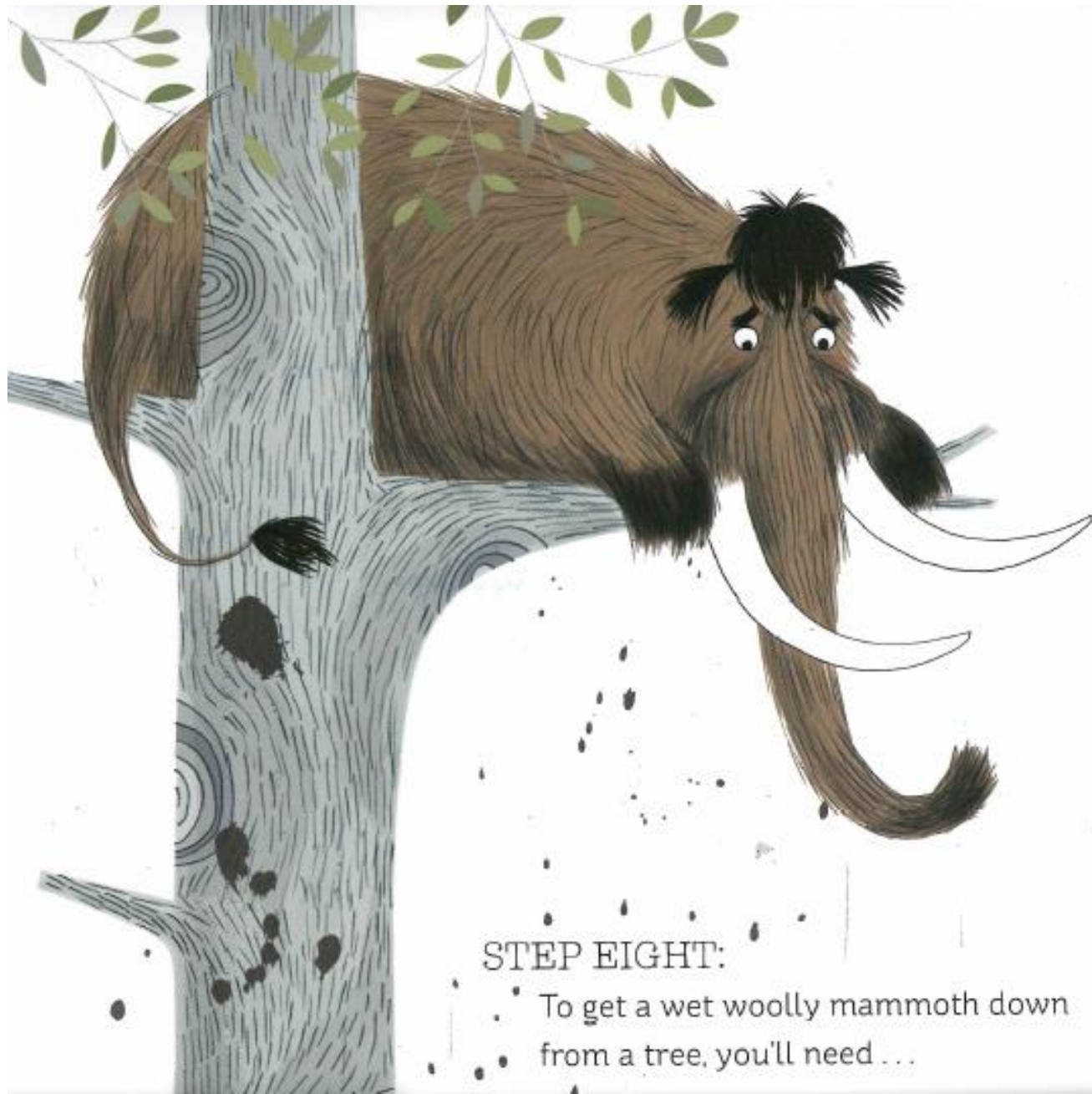
STEP SEVEN:

the mammoth's ...



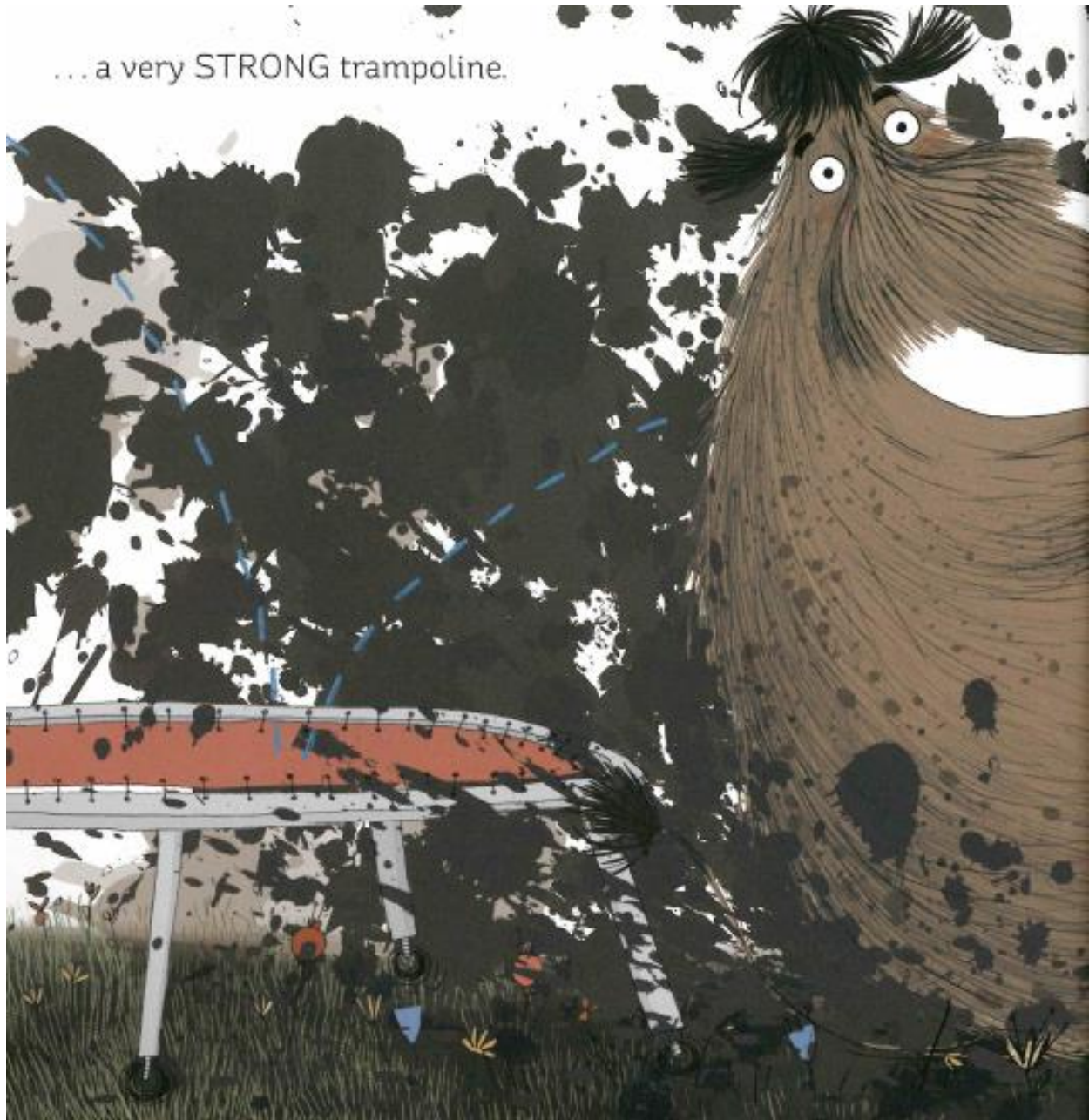


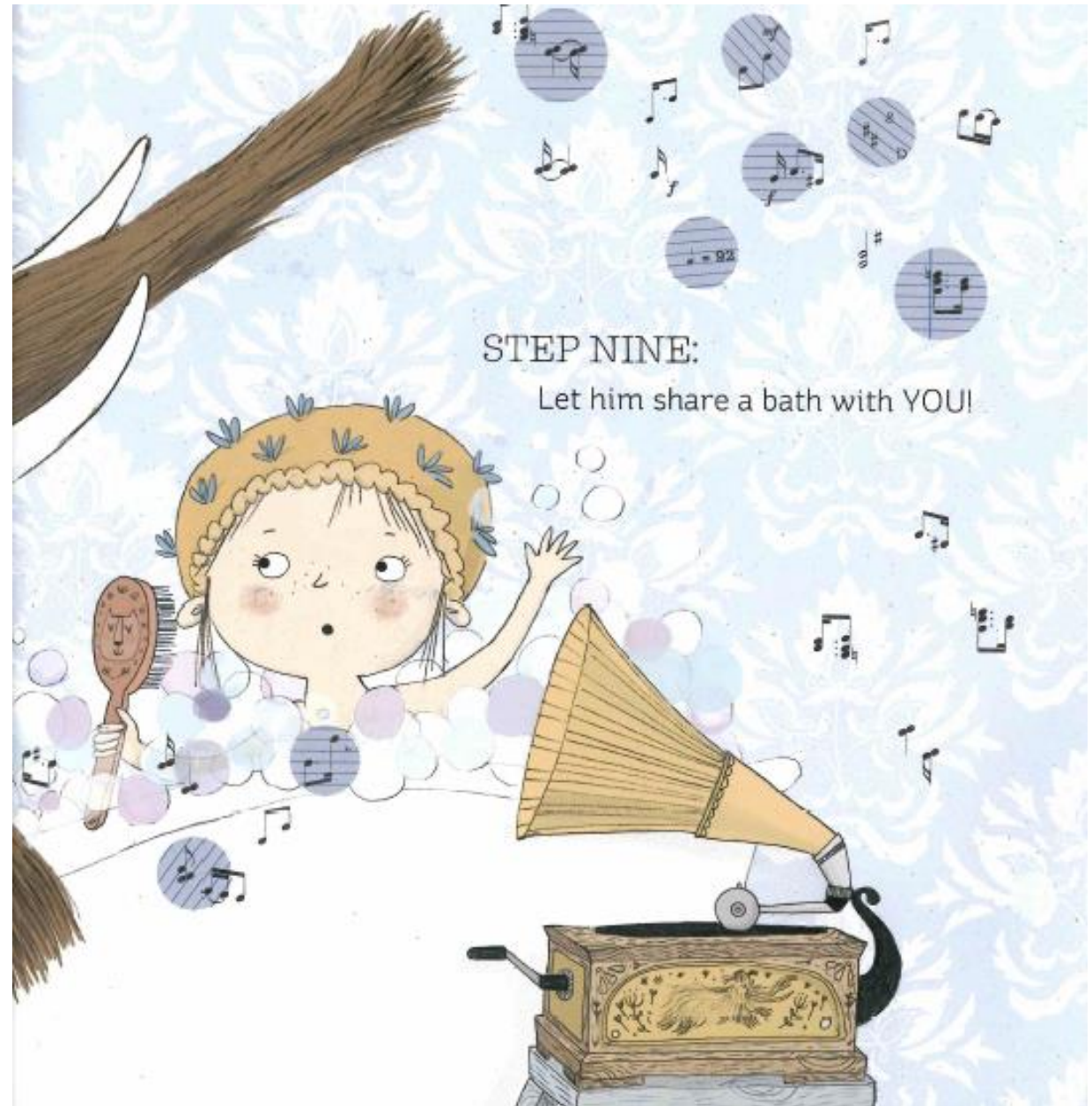
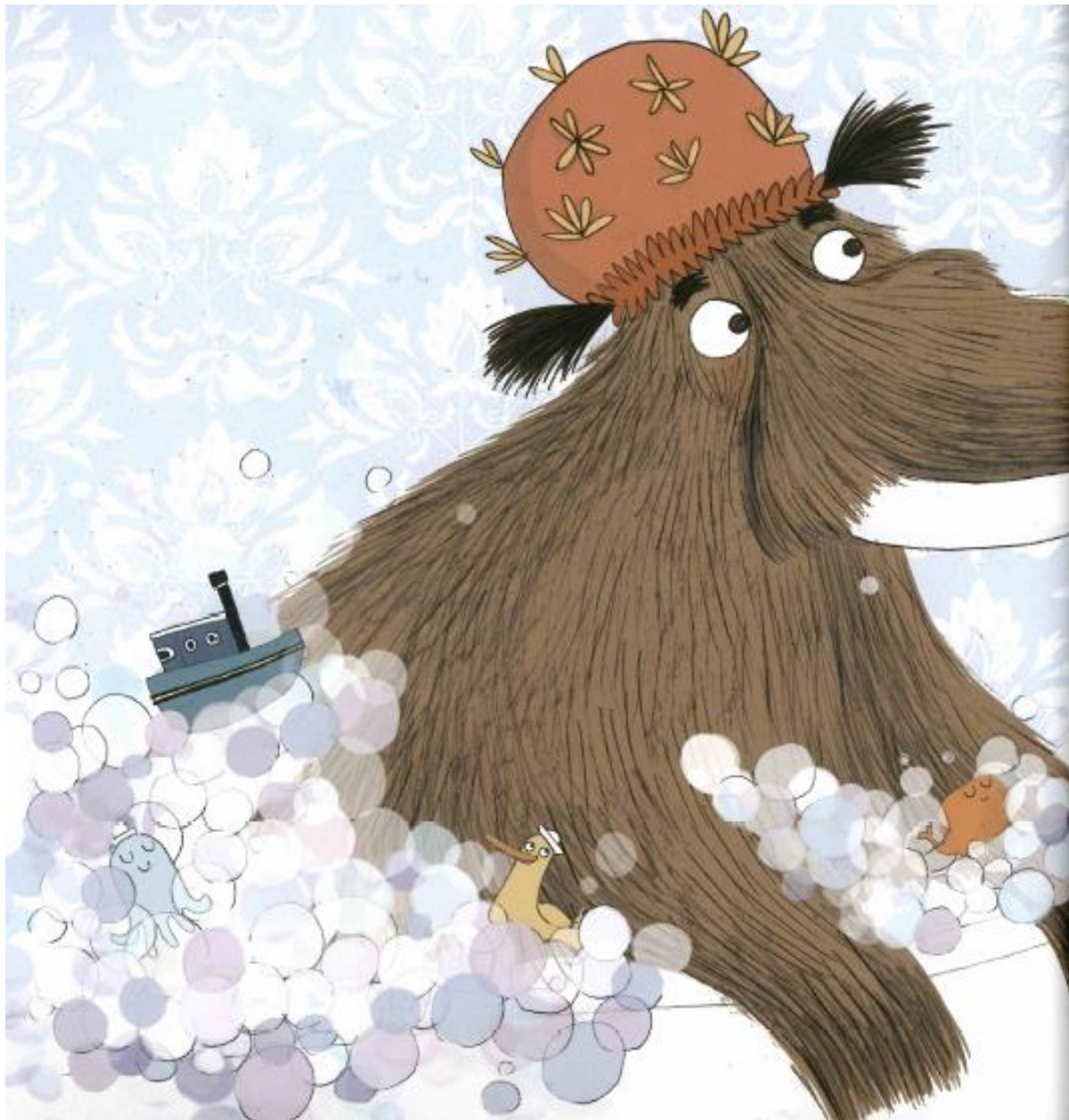
STEP EIGHT:
