A preposition is a word or phrase that tells us where or when something is happening.

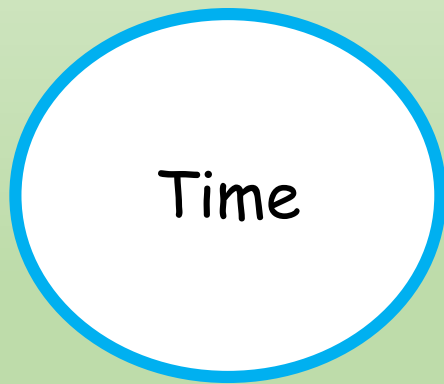
