National Curriculum Teaching Point:

Word families based on common words, showing how words are related in form and meaning [for example, solve, solution, solver, dissolve, insoluble]



Some words are made up of different parts.

This is the root word. It stands alone as a word by itself, but new words can be made by adding prefixes and suffixes.

By adding the prefix “dis-” we change the meaning of the word.

By adding the suffix
“-ment” we change the
meaning of the word again.

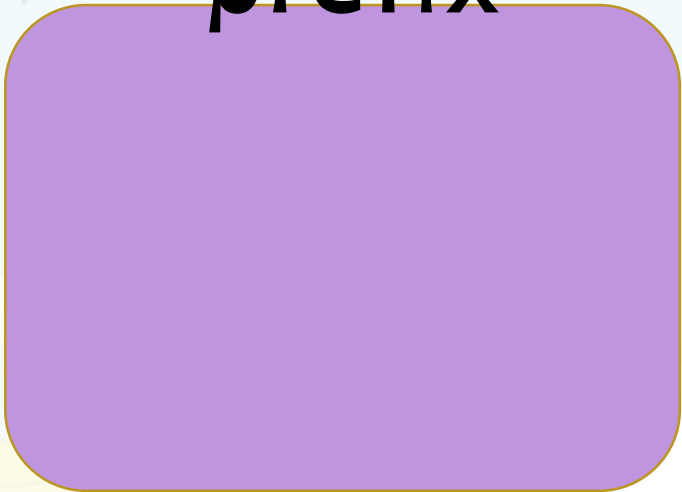
