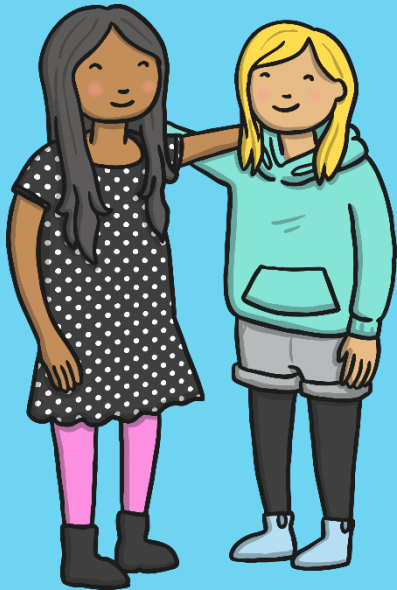

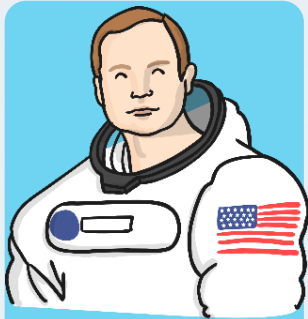

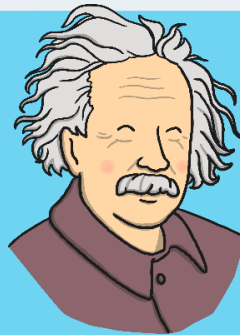
There are lots of significant people who lived in the past and there are lots of significant people who are alive today. Here are a few of them.

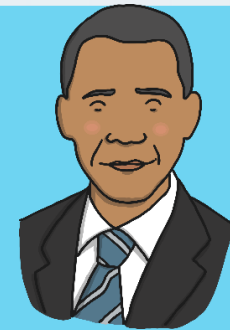

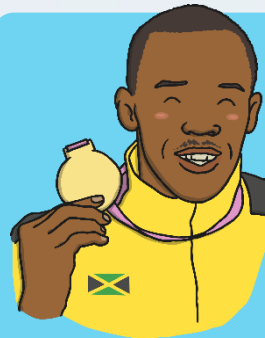

Significant People

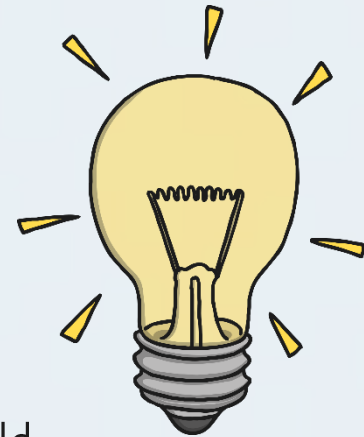
What makes people significant?
