

Dear Parents/Carers,

Thank you for your responses to the reading survey we conducted during Parents Evening. The ability to read is a fundamental life skill and we are committed to ensuring that all children can read and enjoy a range of different texts.

From the reading survey results, we identified that it would be helpful to share with you some reading recommendations for each year group. We sent these out in an email before half term and we have also added them to the website. Scanning the QR codes below will also take you to reading recommendations for each year group.



The survey also highlighted that you would like to have some more reading activities for you to participate in with your child. We have lots of ideas and plans for the new year and these will include:

- Reading activities in class.
- Book mornings for you to find out more about the class text your child is learning about.
- Drop in sessions before and after school for you to read with your child in the classroom and enjoy some of the books in school together.





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Over the Christmas holidays, we are also going to be asking the children in Key Stage 2 to apply for the role of Reading Ambassador. The children will be given an application form to fill in and two children from every class will be chosen. The role of a Reading Ambassador will be to promote reading and books in school and the children will have opportunities to look after the classroom reading corners, create reading recommendations and read with some younger children in school.



As always, we will be promoting reading and books during the week of World Book Day. We have lots of exciting activities planned throughout the week and on the day. We will be writing to you about this nearer the time. During this week, we would also like to hold a Book Swap after school so please keep any books that you have finished reading so that we have an exciting selection of books to swap.

During the year, we will also be holding and number of competitions and reading events which the children always enjoy participating in so please do encourage and support them with this.
