Play together with another member of your household, one person keeping a steady pulse and the other beating a more varied rhythm around it. Make a collection of objects that can be used to beat out rhythms. The children might add old keys, tin cans, iron nails, plastic cartons or blocks of wood to the collection. When children have found one way to make a sound with an object, ask: "Can you make a different sound with that object?" Keys, for example, could be jangled or used to scrape along a wooden board.</p>
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
